Interview with Marcia Malvo and Brenda Wilford

Q. Brenda, how long have you been signing?

A. "20 years. Friends and missionaries Chuck and Nancy Snyder, taught us here at GCA, then I got involved with Pennsylvania School for the Deaf, presently at 100 School House Lane in Philadelphia. I ended up working full-time."

Q. Marcia, have you been deaf for life?

A. "I asked my father if I was born deaf, and I was told that I was diagnosed deaf at age 2 or 3, after severe illness. I almost died in a hospital but God protected me. At first I attended regular school, and then at age 8 I was transferred to a deaf school."

Q. Marcia, do you get enjoyment out of life?


A. "Yes, I'm very happy. I've made mistakes but always knew God was with me. I've encouraged my sons Richard age 30 and Marcus, age 7, to go to school."

"Pray that my husband in Jamaica will be able to come here soon! My favorite verse is Gal. 6:9, 'Let us not become weary in doing well, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up.'"

Note: Marcia teaches Marcus to sign. He was the one doing the signing at GCA Christmas program. He communicates well. Marcia finds texting helpful as it allows the deaf people to communicate. ✧



Q. Marcia, how did you get to come to GCA?

A. "It's been a long time. My sister Lorna Henry was here in America and I was in Jamaica. Lorna kept talking to me about the deaf ministry at GCA. I was already very involved in the deaf ministry in Jamaica. Lorna said to come to America and Brenda (Wilford) will take care of you.

My sister met me at the airport. I was motivated and got involved, fellowshiped with Estelle and other deaf people. I was baptized here at GCA 15 years ago. I was married in Jamaica in June 1997 (Brenda was married July 1997)."
