Candy Sweet Potatoes

This is a recipe from the Golden Eagles Ministry via David Johnson

Ingredients

3 Tbsp. coconut oil

½ cup butter

1 tsp. cinnamon

1 tsp. ginger powder

1 tsp. nutmeg

1 Tbsp. vanilla extract

4 lbs. sweet potatoes

1 lb. brown sugar or molasses

Directions

Wash, peel and cube the sweet potatoes.

Bring 3 quarts of water to boil, add potatoes, cook for 15-20 minutes, potatoes should not be fully cooked, about ¾ of the way. Remove from stove, drain and cool. Put coconut oil, butter, sugar into saucepan. When melted, add cinnamon, ginger, nutmeg, vanilla, simmer 10 minutes. Put sweet potatoes in rectangular baking pan and pour the ingredients over the sweet potatoes. Sprinkle a little paprika on top.

Put sweet potatoes in oven at 375° F for 20 minutes. Remove and serve. ♦

- 3. Paying off the balance of the personal loan acquired for the van purchase. \diamondsuit






Sunday School – Circus Bound





Grace is the distinguishing feature of the New Testament and of the Age of the Church. In fact, the Church Age is often called 'the Age of Grace,' and our gospel is called 'the Gospel of Grace.'

The core feature of grace is God's mercy: His unmerited favor extended to undeserving sinners. Nothing of grace can ever be thought to escape this core feature. However, God's merciful grace is much more than simply unmerited favor. The distinguishing feature of God's grace is something never known or guessed at before: known only to

the Mind of God until revealed by the Holy Spirit, it was truly a divine mystery; something vastly different from anything that was seen in the Law of Moses: new life in Christ.

Romans 8:2-4 NAS

For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and of death. For what the Law could not do, weak as it was through the flesh, God did: sending His own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and as an offering for sin, He condemned sin in the flesh, in order that the requirement of the Law might be fulfilled in us, who do not walk according to the flesh, but according to the Spirit.

John exclaims, "Grace and truth came by Jesus Christ" (1:17). The distinguishing feature of God's

merciful favor to man in the New Testament which differentiates it from the Old, is resurrection power through new life in Christ. In this, grace is not only unlike the Law, it is unlike any other religion known to men, and as such, the transforming power and changeless purpose of the grace that saves is our daily companion along the way to Glory. (Phil. 2:13; Titus 2:11-14)

Grace is dynamic; it's active and powerful. Grace is targeted, with a specific direction and purpose. Grace is no less than the supernatural power of God to make us like Himself.

Grace, grace, God's grace, Grace that will pardon and cleanse within; Marvelous grace, infinite grace, Grace that is greater than all my sin.
