Each year, a few weeks prior to the date of the Bible Bowl. GOGF Ministries announces to interested churches the newly selected scripture chapter that



Children learn in many different ways; some learn by talking about a subject, others learn by being actively involved. We have been blessed in Children's Church to have an eight-volume Bible-teaching curriculum; its overall aim is to help children

respond to the love of God in Christ and learn to walk in the footsteps of faith and obedience.

We have a new incentive that allows the children to express in their own words what Jesus means to them when given the opportunity in class. This is what some of the kids are saying: "I want to glow for Jesus, to let my light shine for Him," "I know that Jesus died on the cross for me", and a 6 year old said, "Jesus is in my heart and I think about Him all the time."

The new incentive is a set of large wooden letters that spell "JESUS". All the letters are black, except for "U", which is white. They have been placed on a secure wooden platform, designed by my Jewish neighbor. Each letter has tiny lights, battery operated with a single switch. Each child that responds can come to the front, share and turn on a letter. The entire platform is resting on a convenient unit, thanks to Brother Richards.

We will continue to give our kids an opportunity to express what they have learned and what Jesus really means to them as they grow, know and love Jesus as their Savior. Feel free to stop by sometime to actually see what we are talking about. \diamond
